Reflections on Readings for The Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time “MASTER, TO WHOM SHALL WE GO? YOU HAVE THE WORDS OF ETERNAL LIFE”

This Sunday we come to the conclusion of our multi-week meditation on the Eucharist. Our readings today ask us to consider this burning question—Do we choose to follow Jesus or is there someone else?



In our first reading ([Joshua 24:1-2, 15-18](#)), Joshua assembled the Israelites as his life on earth was coming to a close. As they were now well established in their promised land, Joshua sought to renew the covenant promise their ancestors made at Mount Sinai. Joshua instructed them, “Decide today whom you will serve . . . As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord.”

In our Epistle reading ([Ephesians 5:21-32](#)), St. Paul is frequently teaching us how we should live as Christians. Today's passage is often understood without considering to whom it was written or the time and culture in which it was written. The central theme is that the marriage bond is akin to Christ's intimate, loving relationship with His Church. We are called to “be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ”; to love each other as Christ has loved us.

In our Gospel reading ([John 6: 60-69](#)), we hear the conclusion of Jesus' Bread of Life Discourse in [John, Chapter 6](#). His disciples found it hard to understand and accept Jesus' command to eat His very flesh and drink His very blood. Many of them left and returned to their former way of life. Jesus asked the twelve, “Do you also want to leave?” Imagine being there in that moment. Would we answer as Peter did, “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.”

Today, we hear two burning questions, “Decide today whom you will serve.”; and “Do you also want to leave?” Perhaps we could sit down and consider the consequences of this decision. What happens if I choose A; what happens if I choose B? For the apostles, they had already made their decision, “Master to whom shall we go, you have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God ” Just like the apostles, we are asked this same question: Do we believe Jesus or not? If we do, we know what we must do.

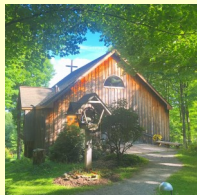

Over the past year, we began with a series of welcoming gatherings for the LGBTQ+ community, for people of color, and for women, as well as hosted our first Sensory Friendly Mass! Dear Parishioners of Holy Trinity Parish, St. Paul Parish, St. Rita Parish, and Kateri Tekakwitha Parish:

We are writing to let you know about an initiative in which all the above parishes, along with their schools, are participating. It is a change that will be generally "behind the scenes" and most of you will not even notice. This Fall, these four parishes and their two schools will be combining their Business Offices into a single central location at St. Cecilia in Irondequoit. In addition, we will be consolidating weekend collection counting into two centralized locations, one in Webster and one in Irondequoit. Each parish will continue to provide parishioners to count their own collections.

It is important to understand that with this move there will be absolutely no sharing of finances. Each of our parishes and schools will maintain their individual finances and remain independent organizations. The only thing we are combining are our business offices; there will be no change to the Parish Offices at each site. There will be no staff reductions or layoffs because of this move.
